

City of Leoti Governing Body met in regular session Monday, July 2, 2018 at 7:00 p.m., at the City Hall Meeting Room.

Mayor Cheryl Green called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Mayor Green asked Interim City Clerk Cendy Morcillo for Role Call; Councilors Charlie Hughes, Jody Crouch, Levi Elder, Ken Farr, Kelma Burch, City Attorney Becky Faurot, City Supervisor Joel Lan and Interim City Clerk Cendy Morcillo. City Superintendent Juan Bocanegra was absent. Also in attendance were Robyn Tokoi, Simone Elder, Courtney Berning, Abby St. George, Tammy Simons, Allen Baker, Aimee Baker and Nikki Bjurstrom.

Burch moved, Farr seconded to approve the agenda. Motion carried unanimously.

Crouch moved, Elder seconded to approve the consent agenda. Motion carried unanimously.

Mayor Green welcomed Abby St. George with AIM Coalition and Ped Net

Council reviewed City Superintendent Bocanegra's written report and asked specific questions about his report including street signs, bindweed and possibly selling old trash truck. Supervisor Landis updated that they are still working on putting up street signs and that Bocanegra has more info on selling trash truck. Council also reviewed the equipment and future projects list.

City Attorney Faurot presented legislative updates.

Council reviewed the written report submitted by Interim City Clerk Cendy Morcillo and asked specific questions about her report.

Mayor Green opened the floor to public comments. Robyn Tokoi introduced herself as the new Wichita County Economic Director. Tammy Simons was present to express her support of the Leoti Master Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan.

Mayor Green opened the discussion on the dangerous dumping publication letter drafted by City Attorney Faurot. Elder moved, Crouch seconded to approve the Dangerous Dumping Publication letter. Motion carried unanimously. Councilor Elder requested that this notification be sent out with the monthly utility bills and published in the Leoti Standard newspaper.

Council discussed the No Left Turn Sign requested by USD #467. Crouch moved, Hughes seconded to table discussion to a future meeting. Motion carried unanimously.

City Attorney Faurot updated Council on the new version of the 2018 STO and UPOC. Faurot stated that there are several substantive changes and recommended Council to pass an ordinance and purchase the new books as well as the yearly online license. Elder moved, Burch seconded to make the necessary updates to the current STO and UPOC. Motion carried unanimously.

Council agreed to set up a Work Session with Code Enforcement Officer on Monday, July 9th, 2018 at 5:30 p.m.

Mayor Green informed Council that she had met with Misty Gardner to discuss WC Park & Rec Director job description, interviews, and the need for a WC Park & Rec Treasurer. She also reminded Council about the possibility of appointing an official to serve on their board on behalf of the City.

Elder moved, Burch seconded to recess into executive session pursuant to the nonelected personnel matters exception, K.S.A. 75-4319(b)(1), to discuss a matter involving a city employee for 5 minutes. Crouch moved, Elder seconded to give said employee a \$1.07 pay increase. Motion carried unanimously. Meeting resumed at 8:10 p.m.

Crouch moved, Farr seconded to recess into executive session pursuant to the nonelected personnel matters exception, K.S.A. 75-4319(b)(1), to discuss a matter involving potential city employees for 15 minutes with Council and Interim City Clerk. Motion carried unanimously. Meeting resumed at 8:25 p.m. Mayor Green declared no action taken.

Crouch moved, Elder seconded for adjournment at 8:32 p.m. Motion carried unanimously.
