

City of Leoti Governing Body met in regular session Monday, November 1, 2021 at 6:30 p.m., at the City Hall Meeting Room.

Mayor Charlie Hughes called the meeting to order at 6:38 p.m.

Mayor Hughes asked for the Role Call; Councilmembers: Kelma Burch, Tammi Meyer-Givens, Tyrrell Tankersley, City Attorney Becky Faurot, City Superintendent Travis Seaton, City Clerk Jeannine Hassell and Code Enforcement Officer Adam Marcotte. City Attorney Faurot reviewed and discussed with council changes need to made on the RV/Camper and Trailer ordinances. Council gave Faurot direction on the changes. Faurot will draw up the ordinances for approval at the next council meeting.
